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John D. Walter was appointed as the Chief Compliance Officer on June 20, 2006. The Office of the Chief Compliance Officer is responsible for assisting the Michigan Strategic Fund board of directors, the Strategic Economic Investment and Commercialization Board, and their employees and agents with compliance issues arising under Chapter 8A of the Michigan Strategic Fund Act, including compliance with internal policies and procedures and applicable laws.

Prior to being appointed as the Chief Compliance Officer, Mr. Walter served as an Assistant Attorney General with the Michigan Department of Attorney General since 1984. In that capacity, he prosecuted complex securities fraud and other white-collar criminal cases, provided legal representation and advice to the State Ethics Board and the Crime Victim Services Commission, and represented various state agencies including the Office of Financial and Insurance Services and the Corporation and Securities Bureau. Before joining the Attorney General's office, Mr. Walter was in private practice since 1979, where his practice focused on securities offerings to raise investment funds for private businesses.

Mr. Walter is a cum laude graduate of the University of Michigan Law School, from which he received his law degree, and a cum laude graduate of the University of Michigan, where he earned a Bachelor of Science degree in actuarial mathematics.
